The intention of these pieces was to create forms which felt visceral and alive. Forms that could easily be natural growths within the flora of a forest floor seen during a walk through the woods. Forms that looks strong and rigid yet mysteriously fluid. I was influenced by human anatomy, botany and entomology.

Each piece was glaze fired multiple times using underglazes, over glazes and various reticulation glazes until the desired look was achieved.
